Examining the question through the interpretive key of building relationships of universal fraternity, responsibility to care for other persons and communities also embraces active participation in social and political commitments to foster care for the environment. One assumes responsibility for harm to the environment because one is first of all responsible for the care of others.

Legal dimensions of conversations aim to highlight a common responsibility to care for others also through a shared commitment to protect the environment as the common home for humanity.
